

INSTALLING YOUR PHONE CONNECTING THE BASE STATION

Connecting the base station

- 1. Plug the power supply & line cord rainto the base station.
- 2. Plug the power supply & line cord into the wall socket.
- 3. Always use the cables provided in the box.



Installing and charging the batteries

- Slide open the battery compartment cover.
- 2. Place the supplied batteries as indicated. Observe polarity Slide the battery compartment cover back.

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
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Put the handset on the base or charge cradle (for ADT2047 only) and charge for 18 hours first time. A beep indicates that the handset is properly placed on the base or





3.2 Answer a Call

Redial the last number

You can redial up to 5¹ of the last numbers called. If you have stored a name in the phonebook to go with the number, the name will be displayed instead. The most recent last number will display at the top of the redial list.

If there is an incoming call during paging, the phone will ring with the incoming call instead of paging.

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3.10 Make an Internal Call This feature is only applicable when there are at least two registered handsets. It allows you to make internal calls, transfer external calls from one handset to another handset and make conference calls. If the called handset is not answered within 60 seconds, the called handset will stop ringing and the calling handset will return to external call.

After you have accessed to all new voice mail messages, VMWI will turn off automatically. When the call list is full, the new VMWI entry will replace the oldest non-VMWI entry in the call list.
