

1. Getting started

WARNING

- Do not place your Digital Photo Frame in the bathroom or other humid areas
- Do not place your Digital Photo Frame near sources of heat and extreme temperatures, such as fluorescent lighting, microwave ovens, heating appliances and direct sunlight.
- Do not disassemble your Digital Photo Frame; there are no user-serviceable parts inside.
- If the LCD screen breaks, do not touch the glass or liquid. Contact Motorola customer support for assistance.
- Use only the power adapter supplied with your Digital Photo Frame.

Compatible picture format

Your Digital Photo Frame can only display pictures that are in JPEG format. Other picture formats may not be detected or displayed correctly.

The pictures will be displayed in alphabetical order.

Care and maintenance

Wipe the frame and the LCD screen gently with a soft, clean, dry cloth.

To remove fingerprints on the LCD screen, wipe gently with a soft, lint-free cloth. Do not use cleaning solutions unless they are designed specifically for LCD screens.

IMPORTANT

Always switch off and disconnect the power adapter before cleaning the Digital Photo Frame.

Setting up your Digital Photo Frame Attaching the stand





You can set to display your frame in landscape or portrait orientation.

Push the stand into the slot on the back of the frame and slide it into either directions as indicated below.







Inserting a memory card

Your Digital Photo Frame supports SD, SDHC and MMC memory cards.



To insert a memory card, push the card firmly into the memory card slot in the correct direction as indicated above.

Removing a memory card

Simply pull the card out of the slot gently.

IMPORTANT

Do not insert a micro or mini memory card without an adapter.

Connecting a USB device

Your Digital Photo Frame supports USB flash drive and card reader.





Mounting your Digital Photo Frame on the wall



Use wall mounting screws (not included) to mount your Digital Photo Frame securely to the wall.

Switching on your Digital Photo Frame

Press any key to power up your Digital Photo Frame.



TIP

Your Digital Photo Frame will also power up automatically when the power source is connected and switched on for the first time

Switching your Digital Photo Frame to standby mode

Press and hold (b) button for 2 seconds.

Viewing your first slideshow



If you have inserted a memory card with pictures that are in JPEG format, the slideshow starts automatically when you switch on your Digital Photo Frame.

TIP

If there is no memory card inserted the first time you switch on your Digital Photo Frame, preloaded photos will be displayed in slideshow

2.3 **Photos Mode**

This mode lets you view pictures/slideshows in full-screen or as thumbnails





Thumbnail view

To access photos mode:

- Press (OK) to enter thumbnail view.
 - Up to 8 thumbnail pictures are displayed.

Display a photo in full-screen

- 2. Press ok to display the photo in full screen.

2.3.2 Start/Stop automatic transition in full-screen view

- 1. Press (OK) to start automatic transition.
- 2. To stop automatic transition, press (OK).



3. To return to thumbnail view, press (b).

2.3.3 Changing pictures manually
You can change the picture that is showing on the screen without having to wait for automatic transition.

Zoom in 2.3.4

You can zoom in to view pictures close up.

2x zoom

- 1. Press (OK) to pause automatic transition.
- Press (OK) for 2 seconds.
 - The photo zooms in to 2x magnification.

Further zoom – Press or more times to zoom in to 4x, 8x, 16x, and back to 1x maginification.

Scroll - Press ♣. ▶. ▲ or ▼ to move the picture displayed on the screen

Exit – Press (b) to return to pause screen.

235 Rotate picture

You can rotate a picture clockwise or counterclockwise.

- 1. Press (ok) to pause automatic transition.
- 2. Press ▲ to rotate the picture clockwise or ▼ to rotate it counterclockwise.
- 3. To resume automatic transition. press (b).

Delete picture from Internal Memory

- 1. In the main menu screen, press ▲ or ▼ to select Internal Memory and press (OK).
- 3. Press ▲.
- The screen displays Delete photo on memory.
- 4. Press OK
- **5.** Press (b) to confirm delete or press (b) to cancel.

WARNING

This will permanently delete the picture that you have selected. Deleted pictures cannot be recovered.



2.3.7 Copy picture from Memory Card to Internal Memory

- In the main menu screen, press ▲ or ▼ to select Memory Card and press (ox).

NOTE

The available memory space to perform this operation is displayed on the top right hand corner of the screen. There are 5 preloaded photos and there is room for up to 5 photos to be stored on the device if user wish to delete preloaded photos and add their own photos.

- 3. Press ▲.
 - The screen displays Copy to memory.
- 4. Press ok to copy or press to cancel.

NOTE

If the memory is full, the screen displays Not enough memory. Delete some pictures to free your space then try to copy again.

2.4 Calendar Mode

This mode lets you view a calendar and clock on the right of the screen and a picture/slideshow on the left of the screen.



To access calendar mode:

- In the main menu screen, press
 or
 to select Calendar and press
 ok.
- 2.4.1 Pause automatic transition
- 1. Press OK .
- 2. To resume automatic transition, press ok again.

2.4.2 Changing pictures manually

You can change the picture that is showing on the screen without having to wait for automatic transition.

Press ◀ to change to the previous picture, or press ▶ to change to the next picture.



2.5 Settings Mode

The settings mode allows you to change the various settings of your Digital Photo Frame.



2.5.1 Access settings mode

In the main menu screen, press
 or
 to select
 Settings and press
 ox.

2.5.2 Change slideshow frequency

You can control the duration between each automatic transition of pictures.

- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Slideshow frequency and press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select a setting (5 seconds, 10 seconds, 30 seconds, 1 minute, 1 hour, 1 day) and press .
- 3. Press 🕲 repeatedly to exit.

2.5.3 Change show transition effect

You can select the slideshow transition effect.

Press ▲ or ▼ to select Show transition effect and press ^(OK).

- Press ▲ or ▼ to select a setting (No effect, Random, Fade out Fade in, Left to Right, Horizontal open, Horizontal close) and press [®].
- 3. Press (b) repeatedly to exit.

2.5.4 Change date & time

You can set the date and time format to be displayed on your Digital Photo Frame.

2.5.4.1 Set Year, Month, Day, Hour and Minute

- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Date & Time setting and press ^(OK).
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select a setting (Year, Month, Day, Hour and Minute) and press ◄ or ► to set the value.
- 3. Press (b) repeatedly to exit.

2.5.4.2 Set Time Format

- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Date & Time setting and press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Time Format and press ◄ or ► to select a format (24h or 12h).
- 3. Press (b) repeatedly to exit.
- **2.5.5 Languages**You can select the display language of your Digital Photo Frame.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Language and press OK.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select a language and press ⊙κ.
- 3. Press (b) repeatedly to exit.



2.5.6 Programmable On/Off time (On/Off schedule)

You can set the Digital Photo Frame to switch on and off automatically at a specific time of the day.

2.5.6.1 Set schedule On/Off

- Press ▲ or ▼ to select 0n/0ff Schedule and press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Auto on/off and press ◄ or ➤ to select a setting (ON or OFF).
- 3. Press (b) repeatedly to exit.

2.5.6.2 Set schedule On time

- 1. Press ▲ or ▼ to select 0n/0ff Schedule and press ⊙K.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Auto on hour and press ◄ or ►
 to set the value
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Auto on minute and press or ► to set the value.
- 4. Press (b) repeatedly to exit.

2.5.6.3 Set schedule Off time

- Press ▲ or ▼ to select 0n/0ff Schedule and press ○κ.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Auto off hour and press or ► to set the value.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Auto off minute and press ◄ or ► to set the value.
- 4. Press (b) repeatedly to exit.

2.5.7 Display

You can change the display brightness and contrast.

- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Display and press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select a setting (Brightness or Contrast) and press ◄ or ► to set the value (0 16).
- 3. Press (b) repeatedly to exit.

2.5.8 Photo view options

You can control the size of the pictures displayed.

- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Photo view options and press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select a setting (Original or Fit to screen) and press ^{OK}
- 3. Press (b) repeatedly to exit.

2.5.9 Default settings

This option resets all settings to the default.

- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Default settings and press ^{OK}.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select Yes and press ⊙K).

2.5.10 Format internal memory

This option deletes all JPEG images on your Digital Photo Frame's Internal Memory.

- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Reset procedure and press ^{(o)K}.
 Press ▲ or ▼ to select 0K and press ^{(o)K}.
- All JPEG images in the Internal Memory are deleted.

WARNING

This will permanently delete all JPEG images in the Internal Memory. Deleted images cannot be recovered.

- Make sure the USB cable is securely connected (page 7).
- Make sure that your pictures are in JPEG format. Note that a large picture file may take some time to appear on the LCD screen
