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Safety and General Information

Important Information on Safe and Efficient Operation

Read This Information Before Using Your Radio.

The information provided in this document supersedes the general safety information in user guides published prior to December 1, 2002.

Transmit and Receive Procedure

Your two-way radio contains a transmitter and a receiver. To control your exposure and ensure compliance with the general population/uncontrolled environment exposure limits, always adhere to the following procedure:

- Transmit no more than 50% of the time.
- To receive calls, release the PTT button
- To transmit (talk), press the Push to Talk (PTT) button

Transmitting 50% of the time, or less, is important because the radio denerates measurable RF energy exposure only when transmitting (in terms of measuring standards compliance)

Exposure to Radio Frequency Energy Your Motorola two-way radio complies with the following RF energy exposure standards and guidelines:

- Australian communications Authority Radio communications (Electromagnetic Radiation—Human Exposure) Standard, 2003
- ANATAL ANNEX to Resolution No. 303 of July 2, 2002 "Regulation of limitation of exposure to electrical, magnetic and electromagne fields in the radio frequency range between 9 KHz and 300GHz" and "Attachment to resolution #303 from July 2, 2002"

To assure optimal radio performance and make sure human exposure to radio frequency electromagnetic energy is within the guidelines set forth in the above standards, always adhere to the following procedures.

Portable Radio Operation and EME Exposure

Antenna Care

Use only the supplied or an approved replacement antenna. Unauthorized antennas, modifications, or attachments could damage the radio and may violate regulations.

Do NOT hold the antenna when the radio is "IN USE." Holding the antenna affects the effective range.

Body-Worn Operation

To maintain compliances with RF exposure guidelines, if you wear a radio on your body when transmitting, always place the radio in a Motorola-supplied or approved clip, holder, holster, case or body harness for this product. Use of Non-Motorola-approved accessories may exceed RF exposure quidelines

If you do not use one of the Motorola-supplied or approved body-worn accessories and are not using the radio held in the normal use position, ensure the radio and its antenna are at least 1 inch (2.5 cm) from your body when transmitting.

Data Operation

If applicable, when using any data feature of the radio with or without an accessory cable, position the radio and its antenna at least one inch (2.5 cm) from the body.

Electromagnetic Interference/Compatibility

Note: Nearly every electronic device is susceptible to electromagnetic interference (EMI) if inadequately shielded, designed or otherwise configured for electromagnetic compatibility. Operation is subject to the following two conditions:

- 1. This device may not cause harmful interference; and
- 2. This device must accept any interference received, including interference that may cause undesired operation.

Facilities

To avoid electromagnetic interference and/or compatibility conflicts, turn off your radio in any facility where posted notices instruct you to do so. Hospitals or health care facilities may be using equipment that is sensitive to external RF energy

Aircraft

When instructed to do so, turn off your radio when onboard on aircraft. Any use of a radio must be in accordance with applicable regulations per airline crew instructions

Medical Devices - Pacemakers

The Advanced Medical Technology Association recommends that a minimum separation of 6 inches (15 cm) be maintained between a handheld wireless radio and a pacemaker. These recommendations are consistent with the independent research by and recommendations of the U.S. Food and Drug Administration

People with pacemakers should:

- ALWAYS keen the radio more than 6 inches (15 cm) from their nacemaker when the radio is turned ON.
- Not carry the radio in the breast pocket.
- Use the ear opposite the pacemaker to minimize the potential for
- Turn the radio OFF immediately if there is any reason to suspect that interference is taking place

Medical Devices - Hearing Aids

Some digital wireless radios may interfere with some hearing aids. In the event of such interference, you may want to consult your hearing aid manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

Other Medical Devices

If you use any other personal medical device, consult the manufacturer of your device to determine if it is adequately shielded from RF energy. Your physician may be able to assist you in obtaining this information.

Safety and General Use While Driving

Check the laws and regulations regarding the use of radios in the area where you drive, and always obey them. If you do use your radio while driving, please:

- Give full attention to driving and to the road.
- Use hands-free operation, if available
- Pull off the road and park before making or answering a call if driving conditions so require

Do not place a portable radio in the area over an air bag or in the air bag deployment area. Air bags inflate with great force. If a portable radio is placed in the air hap deployment area and the air hap inflates. the radio may be propelled with great force and cause serious injury to occupants of the vehicle.

Safety and General Use During Activity

The use of a two-way radio while engaged in activities requiring concentration may cause distraction or otherwise impair your ability to safely participate in such activities. Always use technology safely.

Potentially Explosive Atmospheres

Turn off your radio prior to entering any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere. Only radio types that are especially qualified should be used in such areas as "Intrinsically Safe." Do not remove, install or charge batteries in such areas. Sparks in a notentially explosive atmosphere can cause an explosion or fire resulting in bodily injury or

Note: The areas with potentially explosive atmospheres referred to above include fueling areas such as below decks on boats, fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities, areas where the air contains chemicals or particles (such as grain, dust or metal powders) and any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle engine. Areas with potentially explosive atmospheres are often-but not always-posted.

Blasting Caps and Areas

To avoid possible interference with blasting operations, turn off your radio when you are near electrical blasting caps, in a blasting area, or in areas posted "Turn off two-way radios." Obey all signs and instructions.

Operational Cautions

Antennas


Do not use any portable radio that has a damaged antenna. If a damaged antenna comes into contact with your skin, a minor burn can result.

All batteries can cause property damage and/or bodily injury such as burns if a conductive material-like jewelry, keys or headed chainstouch exposed terminals. The conductive material may complete an electrical circuit (short circuit) and become quite hot. Exercise care in handling any charged battery, particularly when placing it inside a pocket, purse or other container with metal objects.


Battery Charger Safety Instructions:

Save these Instructions

- 1. Do not expose the charger to rain or snow.
- 2. Do not operate or disassemble the charger if it has received a sharp blow, or has been dropped or damaged in any way.
- 3. Never alter the AC cord or plug provided with the unit. If the plug will not fit the outlet, have the proper outlet installed by a qualified electrician. An improper condition can result in a risk of electric
- 4. To reduce the risk of damage to the cord or plug, pull the plug rather than the cord when disconnecting the charger from the AC receptacle.
- 5. To reduce the risk of electric shock, unplug the charger from the outlet before attempting any maintenance or cleaning
- 6. Use of an attachment not recommended or sold by Motorola may result in a risk of fire, electric shock or personal injury.
- 7. Make sure the cord is located so it will not be stepped on, tripped over or subjected to damage or stress.
- 8. An extension cord should not be used unless absolutely necessary. Use of an improper extension cord could result in a risk of a fire and/or electric shock. If an extension cord must be used, make sure
- The nins on the plug of the extension cord are the same number, size and shape as those on the plug of the charger

Getting Started

Installing the AA Batteries

Your radio uses 3 AA Alkaline hatteries

- 1. With the back of the radio facing you, lift the battery latch up to release the hattery cover and remove the cover
- 2. Insert 3 AA Alkaline batteries as shown on the inside of the battery
- 3. Reposition the battery cover and press down to secure.

Note: The T5583 model radios can use a NiMH rechargeable battery instead of 3 AA Alkaline hatteries. A rechargeable battery upgrade kit, is available for these radios.

Installing the NiMH Battery Pack

- 1. Follow step 1 above to remove the battery cover.
- 2. Remove the hattery pack from the clear plastic bag. Do not disassemble or unwrap the battery pack.
- 3. Insert the NiMH battery pack so the metal contacts on the side of the battery are facing outward from the radio to connect with the contacts on the battery door.
- 4. Reposition the battery cover and press down to secure.

The battery icon shows the battery charge level, from full to empty ____ . When the battery is empty, the radio chirps periodically after releasing $\ensuremath{\rho_{\Gamma\!\Gamma\!\Gamma}}$. The radio powers off when the voltage drops below a predetermined level to protect the rechargeable battery.

Note: Remove the batteries before storing your radio for extended periods of time. Batteries corrode over time and may cause permanent damage to your radio.

Using the Desk Stand Charger (Optional Accessory)

The desk stand charger provides drop-in charging convenience for NiMH batteries and can be placed on any flat surface, such as a desk or workbench. Charge the NiMH battery overnight (at least 16 hours) before using it for the first time. After the initial charge, an empty battery is fully charged within 14 hours.

1. Turn the radio off and remove the battery cover

- 2. Remove the battery pack from the clear plastic bag. Do not disassemble or unwrap the battery pack.
- 3. Insert the NiMH battery pack so the metal contacts on the side of the battery are facing outward from the radio to connect with the contacts on the battery door.
- 4. Reposition the battery cover and press down to secure.
- 5. Plug the AC power supply into the plug on the desk stand. 6. Plug the AC power supply into a standard wall outlet.
- 7. Remove the battery pocket inserts from the charger pockets.
- 8. With a radio facing forward, slide it into one of the charging pockets.

- The light on the charging base will glow continuously when radio/battery is inserted.
- When moving between hot and cold temperatures, do not charge the battery until the battery temperature acclimates (usually about 20 minutes)
- For optimal battery life, remove the radio or battery from the charger within 16 hours. Do not store the radio in the charger.

Attaching the Belt Clip

1. Align the belt clip post with the hole in the back of the radio.

2. Gently nush until the clin clicks into place.

Removing the Belt Clip 1. Push down on the release tab at the top of the belt clip to release the catch.

Talking and Listening

To communicate, all radios in your group must be set to the same channel and Interference Eliminator Code.

To talk, press and hold (err). Hold the radio 2 to 3 inches away from your mouth when talking. When you finish talking, release (PTT) (press to talk), release to listen.

Setting a Channel

Your radio has 8 channels. Channels 1-8 are .5 watt.

1. With the radio on, press 😨 . The current channel flashes.

2. Press € or ∌ to set the channel 3. Press err to confirm your selection or 🚭 to continue set up.

Checking the Channel Before Transmitting

Your radio has multiple channels shared on a "take turns" basis. For uninterrupted communication, do not talk on a channel if someone else is currently talking on it.

To check for activity on a channel before you talk, press and hold 🚳 . If you hear static, the channel is clear to use.

Push to Talk Timeout Timer

To prevent accidental transmissions and save battery life, the radio emits a continuous warning tone and stops transmitting if you press (PTT) for 60 continuous seconds

Interference Eliminator Codes help minimize interference by providing you with a choice of code combinations.

1. Press (until the code starts to flash.

2. Press ∈ or ∋ to select the code. 3. Press to (PTT) save the code setting.

Note: You must set the Interference Eliminator Code to [] on an FRS radio that uses Interference Eliminator Codes to communicate with other FRS radios that do not have Interference Eliminator Codes.
