
# Connecting the Base Station and Power Plug

## Setting up the base and handset

Plug the telephone line in the telephone connection socket.

Insert the power plug at the other end in the power outlet. The base station is now ready to operate.

Only use the connection cable supplied.




**CAUTION:**Plug the adaptor to a power outlet that is nearby and easily accessible.

**USE ONLY THE ADAPTER SUPPLIED WITH THIS EQUIPMENT.** Using other power supplies may damage the unit.

## Install and charge the batteries

Insert supplied 2 pieces AAA rechargeable batteries in the compartment, ensuring correct polarity and close the compartment. Place the handset in the base station to charge for 16 hours prior to first use. If you don't properly charge the phone, battery performance will be compromised.



**Warning:** Use only approved rechargeable batteries supplied. Please do not use alkaline or non-rechargeable batteries. It may cause permanent damage to the product and void the warranty.

If batteries are empty, handset LCD will be OFF and the handset will not respond to any key. Handset is then required to be put back on Base Station / Charger cradle to charge. Handset cannot be used until handset name and icon appear. If a handset is not fully charged before use, handset may emit battery low alert tone and battery level indicator shows empty or low level.

### **Battery Low Indications**

When batteries are empty, the handset no longer works. When batteries are completely empty and you have put the handset on the base unit for a short period of time, the Battery symbol may appear to be fully charged but this is actually not the case. The battery capacity will decrease rapidly. We advise you to put the handset on the base unit for 16 hrs so that it can be recharged completely.



When you are in the middle of a conversation and the battery is almost empty, the handset will emit a warning signal. Place the handset on the base unit to charge.



# Using the phone

#### Power on/off

Press and hold key

#### Access the menu

- 1. To enter the menu, press <sup>o</sup>key.
- Use <sup>♠</sup> or <sup>♣</sup> keys to scroll to the menu option you want.
- Press <sup>o</sup>
   <sup>o</sup>
   <sup>o</sup>
   <sup>o</sup>
   key to select further options or to confirm the setting displayed.
- 4. To go back in the menu press key.

## Setting the language

- Press <sup>o</sup>
   <sup>o</sup>
   <sup>o</sup>
   even use <sup>o</sup>
   or <sup>o</sup>
   keys to scroll to 'HANDSET' and press <sup>o</sup>
   even key.
- Use of or keys to scroll to 'LANGUAGE' and press key.
- Scroll to the language you want with of or keys and select keys key.

# Outgoing calls

#### Making a phone call

- 1. Press key. You will hear the dial tone.
- 2. Enter the desired telephone number.

3. Press key when you want to terminate the call.

### Call setup with dial preparation

1. Enter the desired telephone number. An incorrect number can be corrected by pressing key.

**NOTE:** When you haven't pressed a button for 20 seconds, the handset returns to standby mode.

- 2. Press key. The number will be dialled automatically.
- 3. Press key again when you want to terminate the call.

#### Redialling the last number dialled

- 1. Press key. You will hear the dial tone.
- 2. Press key. The number you last called is dialled automatically.

#### Redial one of the last 3 numbers dialled

- 1. Press key. The number you last called appears on the display.
- If you would like to dial one of the last 3 numbers dialled, press or key to select the desired number.
- 3. Press key. The number shown on the display is dialled automatically. After finishing the call, press to hang up.

# Incoming calls

When a call comes in, the handset will start to ring. Press key to answer the incoming call.

# Activate/deactivate hands free speakerphone

This function allows you to communicate in hands free mode without having to put the handset in your ears.

- 1. When you are on the phone, press key to activate the hands free speakerphone.
- 2. Press key again to deactivate the hands free speakerphone.

#### **Mute function**

It is possible to deactivate the microphone during a conversation. Now you can speak openly without being heard by the other party on the line.

- 1. Press key during a conversation. The microphone will be deactivated.
- 2. The kappears on the display.
- 3. Press key again when you want to continue the conversation.

# Setting the receiver volume

During a conversation you can set the volume by pressing the key. You can set the volume alternatively in between 1-5. You can also use or keys to do so.

**NOTE:** You can turn the ringer volume of each individual handset ON or OFF by simply press and hold key in standby.

# **Handset Setting**

## Setting the ring volume and melody

You can change the ringer melody for an incoming call (external) and intercom call (internal).

#### Handset melody

- Press <sup>o</sup>k → key. Use o or keys to scroll to 'HANDSET' and press <sup>o</sup>k → key.
- Use of or keys to scroll to 'RING TONE' and press key.
- 3. Use **⑤** or **❖** keys to scroll to '**EXTERNAL**' or '**INTERNAL**' and press **♀**<sup>K</sup> **◆** key.
- Select the melody you want, and then press <sup>ok</sup> → key.

#### Handset ring volume

- Press <sup>o</sup>
   <sup>c</sup>
   <sup>c</sup>
- Use of or to scroll to 'RING TONE' and presser
   ★ key.
- 3. Use **o** or **\$** to scroll to '**VOLUME**' and press ex **o** kev.

 Select the volume level you want, and then press ○K → key.

#### OR

- 1. Press key in standby. The handset will ring in the current volume.
- Use <sup>↑</sup> or <sup>↓</sup> keys to select the desired volume (0-5).
- 3. Press key again to confirm the setting.

**NOTE:** When the volume is set to 0, the handset will not ring when there is an incoming call and the display will show  $\Delta$ .

#### Auto answer

When there is an incoming call and the handset is on the base, the phone automatically takes the line when lifted. This function can be turned on or off.

- Press <sup>o</sup>g<sup>k</sup> → . Use of or keys to scroll to 'HANDSET' and press <sup>o</sup>g<sup>k</sup> → key.
- Use of or keys to scroll to 'AUTO TALK' and press key.
- 3. Use of or keys to select to 'ON'.

#### Handset name

You can change the name that appears on the screen (max. 9 characters) when handset is in standby mode:

 Press <sup>ok</sup> → key. Use of or keys to scroll to 'HANDSET' and press <sup>ok</sup> → key.

- Use of or keys to scroll to 'HANDSET NAME' and press key.
- 3. The current handset name is shown. Delete the character by key. Use the keypad to enter the new name.
- 4. Press \*\* ♦ key to confirm.

# Turning key beep ON/OFF

You can set the handset to make a beep whenever you press a key.

- Press <sup>o</sup> ★ key. Use o or ★ keys to scroll to 'HANDSET' and press <sup>o</sup> ★ key.
- Use of or keys to scroll to 'KEYPAD BEEP' and press key.
- Use <sup>♠</sup> or <sup>♣</sup> keys to scroll to 'ON' and press <sup>ok</sup> ♠ key.

#### Select base

If you set the handset to 'manual selection', the handset will only choose the base unit you have set.

- Press <sup>o</sup>
   <sup>c</sup>
   <sup>c</sup>
   key. Use or croll to croll
- Use of or keys to scroll to 'SELECT BASE' and press key.
- 3. Use **o** or **v** keys to select to 'MANUAL' or 'AUTO'.

 Select 'MANUAL' if you want to set it as MANUAL mode.

**NOTE:** When you have activated Automatic base selection and the handset is out of range from the current base, the handset will search for the nearest base only during standby (not during communication).

CAUTION: Before you can select a base unit, the handset must be registered to the base first.

## **Key lock**

When the keypad is locked, pressing any key will have no effect during standby (except holding the key).

- 1. Press and hold key. Appears on the display and the keypad is locked.
- Press and hold key again to un-lock the keypad.
- 3. When there is an incoming call, you can still answer the call by pressing key.
- During the call, the keypad functions as normal.
   When the call is ended, the keypad will be locked again.

#### **Phonebook**

You can program 50 phonebook entries in the phone's memory. Names can be up to 16 characters long and numbers up to 24 digits.

### Add phonebook entries

- Press \(^{\subset}\) key until the icon is ON.
- Press <sup>o</sup> ★ key and 'NEW ENTRY' will display.
- Press <sup>o</sup>k → key and enter the name by using the keypad.
- Press ♀ ♦ key to confirm the name.
- Enter the telephone number, press <sup>ok</sup> → key to confirm.

## Dial a phonebook entry

- 1. Press we key to enter the phonebook.
- Enter the first letter of the desired name via the keypad. The first name in the list with this letter appears on the display.
- 3. Press **ਰ** or **\( \frac{1}{2}** keys to search the name you want to dial.
- 4. Press key and the number will be dialled automatically.
- 5. Press key again when you want to terminate the call.

#### Edit name or number

- 1. Press we key to enter the phonebook.
- Press <sup>♠</sup> or <sup>♣</sup> keys to search the name you want to edit.
- 3. Press ♀ key to enter the Phonebook Menu.
- 4. Press of or \$\displays keys to select '**EDIT ENTRY**'.
- Delete the character by the key. Use the keypad to enter the new name.
- 6. Press <sup>o</sup>

  key to confirm.
- Enter / delete the telephone number, press <sup>ox</sup> → key to confirm.

# Delete an entry

- Press key to enter the phonebook.
- Press of or ★ keys to search the name you want to delete.
- 3. Press ♀ key to enter the Phonebook Menu.
- 4. Press of or \$\displays keys to select '**DELETE ENTRY**'.
- Press ♀ ♦ key to confirm.

# Delete all entry

- 1. Press up key to enter the phonebook.
- Press <sup>ok</sup> → key to enter the Phonebook options.
- 3. Press of or keys to select 'DELETE ALL'.

- Press <sup>o</sup>
   <sup>o</sup>
   <sup>o</sup>
   key to confirm and the handset will prompt you to reconfirm the delete all function.
- Press ♀ ♦ key to confirm.

### **Caller-ID Functions**

The handset displays the telephone numbers of incoming calls. This function is only possible if you have subscribed to a telephone operator that provides this service.

Contact your telephone provider for more information. When you receive a call, the numbers are saved in a Call list. This list can hold 20 telephone numbers (each of max. 23 digits). If the number is longer than 14 digits, you can press the key to show the other digits.

#### New calls

When you've received a new unanswered call, the display will show 'XX MISSED' and 'XX' indicates the number of calls missed.

# Consulting the call list

- Press ♣ key. The last received call is shown on the display.
- NOTE: If the list is empty, 'EMPTY' is shown on the display. If not, you can see the name, number and date / time.
- 3. Pressing the key the following will be shown on the display. You can scroll from name to number

and date time by pressing the button. Use key to scroll to the next call. Use key to show the previous call.

4. You can leave the Call list by pressing the key.

# Calling a number from the call list

Scroll through the Call list until the desired number is shown on the display.

Press key. The number will be dialled automatically.

# Erasing a number from the call list

Scroll through the Call list until the desired number is shown on the display.

- Press <sup>o</sup>★ key and then use of or ★ keys to select 'DELETE'.
- 2. Press <sup>ok</sup> ♦ key to erase the number.

# Erasing all numbers from the call list

# **NOTE:** You can only erase those read numbers from the call list.

Scroll through the Call list until the desired number is shown on the display.

- Press <sup>o</sup> ★ key and then use o or ★ keys to select 'DELETE ALL'.
- Then press ♀ ♦ key to erase the number.

# Store a number from the call log into the phonebook memory

Scroll through the Call list until the desired number is shown on the display.

- Press <sup>o</sup>k → key and then use o or keys to select 'SAVE TO PB'.
- Press ♀ ♦ key again.
- 3. The last character of the current CID name will be blinking and you can then edit the name.
- 4. Press ♀ key to save the name, and you can then edit the telephone number.
- 5. The last digit of the telephone number will blink and you can then edit the telephone number.
- Press <sup>ox</sup>

   R → key again to confirm and to go back to the call list.

# **Date Time Setting**

No manual setting is required to adjust Date and Time as there are no clock enabled features in this unit. If you have Caller ID on your telephone line and the operator sends date and time\*, your unit's clock will be set automatically on an incoming call. This is just to register the Date & the time the call was received.

<sup>\*</sup> Applicable only for FSK caller ID system.

# Register / De-register a Handset

# Register to a DECT base

You can register 5 handsets to one base unit. By default, a handset is registered as handset 1 on a base unit upon delivery (base unit 1). You only need to register a handset if:

- The handset registration has been removed from the base unit. (e.g. for re-initialization)
- If you want to subscribe a different handset to this base unit.
- Press <sup>o</sup> ★ key. Use o or ★ keys to scroll to 'REGISTER' and press <sup>o</sup> ★ key.
- Use scroll key to select the number of the base unit (1-4) you would like to register the handset. The unit will ask for the PIN code (4 digits, default one is 0000), then the display will show 'PRESS BASE'.
- 3. Now disconnect or power OFF the main base AC adaptor (not charge cradle) from the power plug and connect back, so that the base unit will go in to registration mode automatically and start looking for handsets. When the handset is registered, it will show 'ALCOM' followed by the handset number. .

**Note:** Base unit will exit registration mode after 3mins. If you cannot register within 3mins please start again from the beginning.

# Removing a handset

- 1. You can remove a handset from a base to allow another handset to be registered:
- Press <sup>o</sup>

- 3. Enter the pin code '0000' and press <sup>ok</sup> ♦ key.
- Enter the handset number (1-5) you want to remove and press <sup>ok</sup> → key. The unit will go back to Menu, the removal is done.
- 5. If not, it will ask again to enter the handset number.

**NOTE:** You can only remove existing handsets and others than the one you are using. These functions only work when more than one handset (like a Twin/ Triple version) is registered to the base.

# Call Transfer and Intercom between 2 Handsets

# Call transfer and conference call during an external call

During an external call, press key followed by the number (1-5) of the other handset. The other handset will start to ring:

When the other handset takes the line you can talk internally.

- If you hang up, the external line will be connected with the other handset.
- If you press and hold key for 2 seconds you can talk with the 2nd handset and external line at the same time (conference call) Or press key again to return to the external call. Press the key to end the call.

# Internal call (intercom)

- In standby press key followed by the number (1-5) of the other handset.
- 2. The other handset will start to ring. You can stop the ringing by pressing the key or key or key.
- 3. If the other handset answers the call by pressing the key you can talk internally.
- 4. Press key to end the call.

#### Reset of the Handset

This will undo all changes and set back all default settings (ringer volume, ringer melody, etc...).

- Press <sup>o</sup>

   <sup>o</sup>

   key. Use o or or keys to scroll to handset and press <sup>o</sup>

   key.
- Use of or keys to scroll to 'RESET' and press key.
- Enter the PIN code '0000' and press <sup>ok</sup> → key. The unit will go back to standby.

## **Base Setting**

## Setting the dialling mode

There are two types of dialling mode:

- DTMF / Tone dialling (the most common) (default)
- Pulse dialling (for older installations)

#### To change the mode of dialling:

- Use of or keys to scroll to 'DIAL MODE' and press key.
- Use of or keys to select 'TONE' or 'PULSE' and press key.

## Flash button (R)

When you press \*\* key (also called recall) during conversation, the unit generates a line break of 100 ms or 600 ms. It also gives you the possibility to transfer calls using this key when you have connected to a PABX system and / or to use the special services of your telephone provider.

Example: When on an external call, press this key to get a fresh dialling tone or to access call waiting line\* when you hear the signal. Press the key again to toggle between your two callers.

<sup>\*</sup> Call waiting(second call) must be supported by your telephone service provider.

# Changing the PIN code (system PIN code)

Certain functions are only available if you know the PIN code of the base. The PIN code has 4 digits. The default PIN code setting is '0000'. If you would like to change the PIN code and set your own secret code, do the following:

- Press <sup>o</sup>k → key. Use o or keys to scroll to base and press <sup>o</sup>k → key.
- Use of or \( \display \) keys to scroll to 'SYSTEM PIN' and press \( \text{SY} \) \( \display \).
- Enter the OLD pin and press <sup>ok</sup> → key. Enter the NEW pin and press <sup>ok</sup> → key.
- Press the NEW pin again and press <sup>or</sup> → key. If it is successful, it will display 'PIN CHANGED'.

# **Troubleshooting**

If you have difficulty with your phone, please try the suggestions listed below.

Problem	Cause	Solutions
No dialing tone when pressing Key	<ul> <li>a. Telephone cord of the base station is not plugged in.</li> <li>b. The adapter cord is not plugged in correctly in the base station</li> <li>c. The line is busy, as another handset is used</li> </ul>	a. Check that the telephone list cord has been plugged into the base station and the phone socket.  b. Check the base station DC socket and the AC adaptor plug (remove and plug-in).  c. Wait until the line is unoccupied.
When connect- ed to a PABX, cannot make outgoing calls or call reaches a wrong number	Dialing prefix is needed.	Inset the dialing prefix.
"SEARCHING" is displayed.	a. Base station out of range.     b. Base station not connected to mains.     c. Handset out of Registration with base.	a. Reduce the range. b. Connect base station to mains. c. Please register the handset with base.
