1. Insert the power plug correctly until it is firmly in place. Failing to do so, may cause fire.
2. Do not use a damaged power plug, cord or outlet, as this may cause electric shock or fire.
3. Do not touch the power plug with wet hands, as this may cause electric shock.
4. Do not connect more than one appliance to a single outlet, as an overheated outlet may cause fire.

Basic Operation

1. Power on/off

POWER ON: Plug in the adaptor to the AC outlet, and then insert the DC plug into the photo frame. The LCD panel will light on.

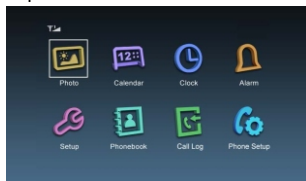
POWER OFF: Pull out the DC plug on the photo frame.

Also can use the **POWER** button on the **REMOTE** to **ON/OFF** the unit.

2. Main Menu Screen

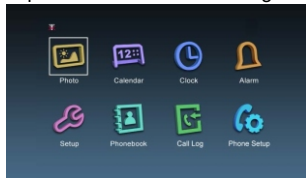
When power is on, the main menu screen will show up. User can press **menu** key at any time to enter the main menu screen.

When the digital photo frame with Base linked:

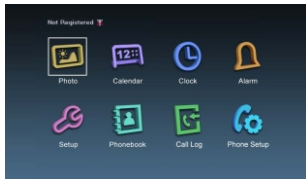


Note: The number “1” indicates the handset number. It can be 1 to 6.

3. View photo


CAUTION: Please Insert or Remove the MEMORY CARD when the photo frame is switched OFF.

Select [Photo] icon by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to enter photo application, or press the  button to enter photo application.

If user set “Auto-play” to “ON”, it will enter the slide show mode automatically; if user set “Auto-play” to “OFF”, it will enter file manager or thumbnail mode. If there are no photos, it will return to main menu.

4.Show Calendar and set:

- Display: Display the current calendar.
- Set Date: Set the current date using the navigation keys
- Exit: Exit Calendar Application.

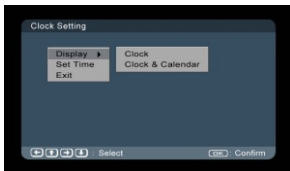
Display screen of calendar

Note: Time should be set in 24 Hour Format. When power is

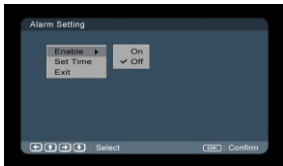
switched OFF using the POWER button CLOCK will still remain running, however if the adaptor is unplugged or switched OFF you have to reset the CLOCK time again.

There are three selections:

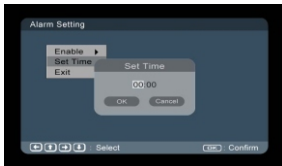

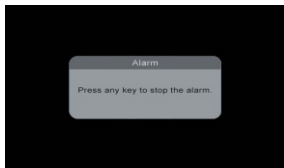

If the alarm is set and the time is reached for the alarm, the polyphonic tone will ring and the following screen will be shown as up:

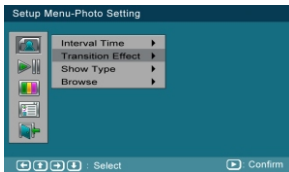


User can press any key to exit the alarm mode and end the alarm tone or it will be off automatically after 5 minutes of continuous alert.

7.Setup Menu

Select [Setup] icon by navigator key in the main menu and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to proceed, the LCD screen will show as below:



There are 5 selections:

-  : Display setup
-  : Custom setup
-  : Exit

By navigator key, and press  (on the photo frame) or  (On the remote control), you will setup the functions.

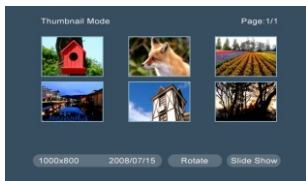
7.1 Photo setting:

- Interval time: The time during playing photos, there are various selections.
- Transition Effect: The format for playing photos. There are 14 effects and totally 16 selections.
- Show Type: The type of photo display. There are 2 selections: full screen and fit screen.
- Browse: The display format for managing photos. There are 2 selections: file manager or thumbnail.



- File Manager Mode: If you set the browse method to file manager, when you are playing photos, press    (on the photo frame) or   (on the remote control), the following screen will be shown. On the left side, the selected photo will be shown:





- Thumbnail: If you set the browse method to thumbnail, when you are playing photos, press    (on the photo frame) or   (on the remote control), the following screen will be shown:



Rotate photos during thumbnail mode:

Step1: Select [Rotate] icon by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to proceed.

Step2: Select one photo by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to rotate the selected photo.

7.2 Auto-Play setting:

- Photo: If it is set to “ON”, when user select the Photo feature in the main menu, it will enter the slide show mode automatically. If user set it to “OFF”, it will enter thumbnail or file manager mode for user viewing the photo.

7.3 Display Setup:

- Contrast: User can set the contrast of LCD
- Brightness: User can set the brightness of LCD
- Saturation: User can set the saturation of LCD



7.4 Custom setup:

- Language: User can set the language of menu.
- Style: There are 4 selections:
- Repeat Mode: For showing photos.
 - Off: turn off the repeat mode
 - One: repeat playing the selected photos once
 - Folder: repeat all the photos in this file folder
 - All: Repeat all the photos.
- Factory default: All the settings return to default settings.

Exit: Exit the Setup Application.

8.Phonebook Menu

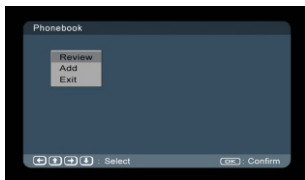
The photo frame can store up to 40 entries in the phonebook with name, number and picture.(Name or Number should not exceed more than 16 characters each.)

Select [Phonebook] icon by navigator key in the main menu and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to proceed.

Note:

1. Only JPEG files can be added into the phonebook.
2. Insert external memory with photos to the digital photo frame before adding or editing phonebook. Otherwise, the number cannot be saved.



Screen after entering Phonebook application:

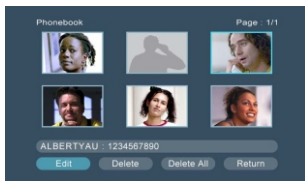


There are three selections:

- Review: review the phonebook record
- Add: add new entry into phonebook
- Exit: return to main menu

8.1 Phonebook Review Menu



Select [Review] by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to proceed, the LCD screen will show as below:







There are four selections:



- Edit: edit the selected entry.
- Delete: delete the selected entry.
- Delete All: delete all entries.
- Return: return to Phonebook application screen.

8.1.1 Edit Menu

Step1: Select one entry during phonebook review screen and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control).



Step2: Select [Edit] by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to proceed.



Step3: Select digits or characters by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to input name or number.



Step4: Select [Save] by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to proceed.

Note: Replacing the picture in any entry is not possible.
Please delete the entry and add again with a new picture.



8.1.2 Delete record



Step1: Select one entry during phonebook review screen and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control).



Step2: Select [Delete] by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to proceed.

Step3: Select [OK] by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to confirm.



8.1.3 Delete All records

Step1: Select one entry during phonebook review screen and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control).



Step2: Select [Delete All] by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to proceed.



Step3: Select [OK] by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to confirm.

8.2 Add phonebook menu



Step1: Select [Add] icon by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to

proceed.

Step2: Select digits or characters by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to input name or number.



Step3: Select [Save] by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to proceed.

Step4: Press button  (on the photo frame) or  button (on the remote control) to select one photo.

Step5: Select [Save] icon by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to confirm.

9.Call log Menu



The photo frame can store up to 30 call logs.

Select [Call Log] icon by navigator key in the main menu and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to proceed. The following screen will be shown.



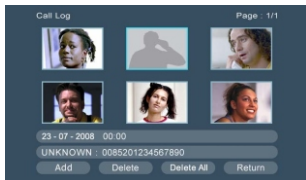
There are four selections:

- All Calls: including all missed and received calls
- Missed calls: not answered calls (including Call-waiting CID*)
- Received calls: answered calls (including Call-waiting CID*)
- Exit

The photo frame can't save the logs for calls without CID*. If user select [All Calls] or [Missed calls], [Received calls] and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control), the LCD screen will show like below.

NOTE: Caller ID, Call Waiting Caller ID and Call Waiting are



network features and must be subscribed in order to function. Above functions may not be possible if you link the PHOTO FRAME to another BASE UNIT of a different manufacturer.







There are four selections:



- Add: save the call log to phonebook
- Delete: delete the selected call log
- Delete All: delete all call logs
- Return: return to Call log screen.



9.1 Add call log to phonebook



Step1: Select one log during call log review screen and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) during call log review screen.

Step2: Select [Add] by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to proceed.



Step3: Select digits or characters by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to input number or name.



Step4: Select [Save] icon by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to proceed.



Step5: Select one photo by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to proceed.

Step6: Select [Save] icon by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to confirm.



9.2 Delete one call log



Step1: Select one log during call log review screen and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) during call log review screen.



Step2: Select [Delete] icon by navigator key and press  (On the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to proceed.

Step3: Select [OK] by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to confirm.



9.3 Delete All call logs

Step1: Select one log during call log review screen and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) during call log review screen.

Step2: Select [Delete All] icon by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to proceed.

Step3: Select [OK] by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to confirm.

10. Phone Setup Menu



Select [Phone Setup] icon by navigator key in the main menu and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to proceed.



There are four selections;

- Registration: link with cordless system
- Ringer Pattern: select ringer pattern
- Ringer Loudness: select current loudness
- Exit: Return to main menu.






10.1 Registration

Step1: Select [Registration] icon by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to proceed.

Step2: Select digits by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to input PIN.



Note: The default PIN is “0000” and the PIN code must be 4 digits.



Step3: Press and hold  the key on the base for about 15 seconds.

Step4: Select [Save] icon by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to proceed, the LCD screen will show “Searching...”



If the DPF registries succeed, the LCD screen will show “OK”.



10.2 Ringer Pattern

Step1: Select [Ringer Pattern] icon by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to proceed.

Step2: Select desired ring pattern by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to confirm.

10.3 Ringer Loudness

Step1: Select [Ringer Loudness] icon by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to proceed.

Step2: Select desired ring loudness by navigator key and press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to confirm.

11.Operation about incoming call

11.1 LCD display during a call

The photo frame will stop any existing operations during an incoming ring, the photo frame will return to its previous operation after the call is ended.

Case 1: For an incoming call if the number matches with the phonebook, the displayed name will be the phonebook name instead of the caller ID name*. The LCD screen will show as below.

NOTE for CID name : Caller ID name information from the operator is network dependent and is not available in all countries. Please check with your network provider for availability of this service. However name will be displayed if incoming number is matched with your phone book entry if any.



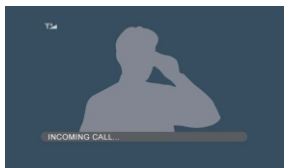
Case 2: For an incoming call if the number does not match with the phonebook, the unknown picture and the CID name* will show as below.



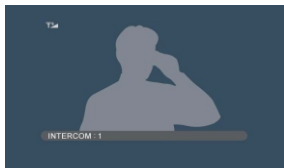
Case 3: For an incoming call if the caller ID name is absent or somehow unavailable, the LCD will show as below.





Case 4: If there is an external call without Caller ID, the LCD will show as below.





Case 5: If there is an internal call, the LCD will show as below.



11.2 Answering call

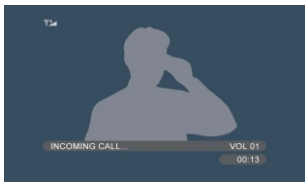
If there is an external call, user can press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to answer the call, the LCD screen will show as below.







User can press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to mute the MIC, the LCD screen will show as below:



If there is an external call without CID, after answering the call, the LCD screen will show as below.



User can press  or  to adjust the speakerphone volume during a call, and can press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to end the call.



11.3 Call Transfer



User can transfer an external call from a handset to the photo frame. When the handset initiates the transfer, the LCD screen will show as INTERCOM: 1.

Note: The photo frame can't initiate a call transfer. This function may not work when used with other base and handset.

11.4 Call Waiting*

If there is another incoming call while you are talking on the phone, the LCD will show the information of the second call.

1. User can press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) to answer the second call, and the first call will be on hold.

2. User can press  (on the photo frame) or  (on the remote control) swap caller1 and caller2.

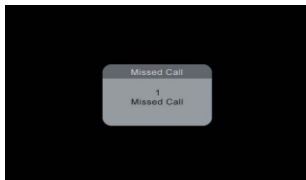
Note: Call Waiting is a network dependent feature. Please check with your service provider for availability of this service and subscribe if necessary.



For the call-log handling in call-waiting case:

- Unanswered the second call: logged in missed call list
- Answered the second call: logged in received call list
- Calls without CID will not be logged

11.5 Missed calls Display

If there are missed calls, the following screen will be shown.





User can press any key (except ) to return the main menu, if user press  , the unit will power off.

Two types of memory inside photo frame:

- SDRAM for program running = 64Mbits;
- Flash for storing photos in Phonebook = 32Mbits.

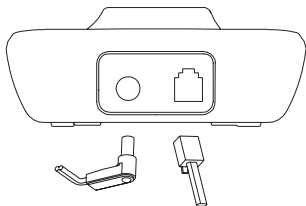

Connecting the plugs to the corresponding sockets in the base station (they can not be connected incorrectly because the sockets and plugs are designed prevent reverse poling). Lay the cable under the telephone to the rear. Plug the telephone line in the telephone connection socket. Insert the power plug at the other end in the power outlet. The base station is now ready to operate.

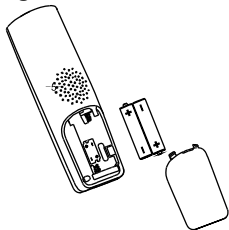

Getting Started

Install and Charge the Batteries



Insert two pieces rechargeable AAA batteries in the compartment, ensuring correct polarity and close the compartment.

- Please wait for 30 seconds after removing the old batteries when change and install a new pair battery.
- Place the handset in the base station to charge for 16 hours prior for first use. If you don't properly charge the phone, battery performance will be compromised.
- Use only with provided batteries.

⚠Warning: The handset will not work and may be damage if wrong batteries are used or inserted incorrectly.

Basic Operation



Make a Call

1. Press the  or  key, wait for a dial tone, then dial the desired number.
2. After finishing the conversation, press  key or place the cordless handset into the charger.
The talk timer will be shown for about 2 seconds before return to idle mode.


Pre-dialling




1. When the handset is in idle mode, dial the desired number.
2. Press **C/⊗/B** key to cancel the wrong digit, dial the correct one again.
3. Press the  or  key, the number will be automatically dialled out.
4. After finishing the conversation, press  key or place the cordless handset into the charger.
The talk timer will be shown for about 2 seconds before return to idle mode.

Adjust the Receiver or Speaker Volume



While the phone is in talk mode, press  or  key on the handset to adjust the receiver or speaker volume of the handset. There are 5 possible volume selections for handset speaker and receiver. The display will show the current volume level during adjusting.

Answer a Call


When the phone rings, the icon  will flash and the LCD on the handset will show "CALL". If you have subscribed to Caller ID service from your local telephone company, the incoming call information will be shown.

1. Press the  or  key to answer a call.
2. After finishing the conversation, press  key place the cordless handset into the charger.


Auto Answer

If you set on the "AUTO TALK", just need to pick up the cordless handset from the charger to answer the call directly, needn't press  or  key.






Handset Speaker Phone

Press  key to activate or deactivate the handset speaker.

Dialing from the Phone Book

Press  button when in standby mode, the first entry in the phone book appears.



Note: If there is no record in phone book, "PB EMPTY" information will display

1. Press  or  key to select the required record from the phone book.
2. Press  or  key to dial the number.
3. After finishing the conversation, press  key or place the cordless handset into the charger to terminate the call.

Intercom

You can make an intercom between any two handsets (if

you have more than one handset).

1. When the handset is in idle mode, press and hold ***_{INT}** key, "INT-NUMBER?" will be shown, dial the called handset number to call.
2. The called handset will ring and the LCD will show the calling handset's name and number.
3. Press  or  key in the called handset to answer.

Call Transfer

The function allows you to transfer an external call from a handset to another handset.

1. When the caller on line, press and hold ***_{INT}** key on the calling unit and dial the handset number for transfer. The line will be put on hold.
2. After the called unit answers the call, the intercom will begin between the two handsets.
3. If you want to transfer the call to the called unit, end the call at the calling unit. The call will be automatically transferred to the called unit.

Note: If the called unit doesn't answer the intercom call within 30 seconds, the calling unit will return to the talk mode with the caller.

Call Waiting

If you have subscribed to the service of CID on Call waiting, the telephone will show the phone number of another incoming call while you are talking on the phone.

1. Press **R** key to put the current call on hold and talk with the second caller.
2. Subsequent presses of **R** key will toggle you between these 2 callers.

Caller information of this second call will be stored in the call log.

Three-way Conversation

You may have a 3-way conversation using the intercom and external line.

1. When the caller on line, press and hold ***_{INT}** key on the calling unit and dial the handsets number. The line will be put on hold.
2. After the called unit answers the call, the intercom will begin between the two handsets.
3. Press **→/OK** key on the handset to enter menu, then press **▲Vol+** or **▼Vol-** key to select "CONFERENCE", press **→/OK** key on the handset to confirm. The three-way conference will begin between the two handsets and the caller.

Note: Only the calling unit can operate the "CONFERENCE".

Muting the Ringer volume

Press and hold **C/⊗/⊗** key in idle mode to activate or deactivate the handset Ringer. The **⊗** icon turns on or off.

Muting the Microphone

Press **C/⊗/⊗** key can switch the microphone on or off during a call. The **⊗** icon turns on or off.

Paging the Handset

If a handset has been misplaced, it is possible to call all the handsets.

Short press **Page** key on the base to station.

To stop the page call:

Short press any key on the handset or press **page** key briefly on the base.

Switching the Key Lock On/Off

Press and hold **#_{ON}** key to activate or deactivate the key lock. The **ON** icon turns on or off.

Redial Function

The last 10 numbers you dialed out will be separately stored in handset redial memory.

Review and Dial Redial Record

1. When the handset is in idle mode, press **▲Vol+** key to

display the last redial record. If the redial record is empty, "EMPTY" will be shown.

2. Press \blacktriangle Vol+ or \blacktriangledown Vol- key to select the desired redial number.
3. Press \hookrightarrow or \blacktriangleleft key, the telephone number is automatically dialed out.

Save Redial Number

1. When the handset is in idle mode, press \blacktriangle Vol+ key.
2. Press \blacktriangle Vol+ or \blacktriangledown Vol- key to select the desired redial number.
3. Press \rightarrow /OK key to enter menu, press \blacktriangle Vol+ or \blacktriangledown Vol- key to select "SAVE NUMBER", press \rightarrow /OK key on the handset, the selected number will be shown, press \rightarrow /OK key, "ENTER NAME" will be shown and input the desired name. You must input the name, otherwise the record can't be saved.

Delete a Single Redial Record

1. When the cordless handset is in idle mode, press \blacktriangle Vol+ key.
2. Press \blacktriangle Vol+ or \blacktriangledown Vol- key to select the desired redial number.

Delete All Redial Records

Caller ID Service

The caller's information will be displayed and recorded if you have subscribed to Caller ID service from your local telephone company.


When the telephone rings, the caller's information will be displayed on the handset LCD display. This information includes the phone number and name (if supported). The handset can store up to 20 calls for later review (up to 16 digits and 16 characters for each record). When the memory is full, a new call automatically replaces the oldest call in the memory.


Note:

If the caller's information includes Date/Time, the Date/Time will be stored with the record.


If the caller number is same as one of phonebook memory, the matched name stored in the phonebook memory will be displayed.


The handset will prompt user if there is unanswered call.

When the handset is in idle mode, “?” will be displayed prior to other display information.


If you reviewed all the missed calls from handset, the display “?” will be disappeared.



Note:

1. If you reviewed all the missed calls from one handset, the display “?” will still show on other handsets.

2. Press  INT key to toggle the display between name and number.


Review Caller ID Record

1. When the handset is in idle mode, press  key to display the information for the last call received.

2. Press  or  key to review all call records.

3. When you scroll to the end, “--(GO BACK)--” will be shown.

Date / Time

5. Input the correct time, the format is: hour/minute (hour range: 00-23, minute range: 00-59).
6. Press \rightarrow /OK key to confirm the setting.

Note: If the value you input is over the range during setting, you can't enter next setting by pressing \rightarrow /OK key, please enter the correct setting again.

Registration Register

Up to 6 cordless handsets can be registered to one base.

1. Press \rightarrow /OK key.
2. Press \bullet \uparrow Vol+ or \uparrow \downarrow Vol- key to select "REGISTRATION" and press \rightarrow /OK key.
3. Press \bullet \uparrow Vol+ or \uparrow \downarrow Vol- key to select "REGISTER" and press \rightarrow /OK Key, Press \bullet \uparrow Vol+ or \uparrow \downarrow Vol- key to select a base and press \rightarrow /OK key, the LCD will display "ENTER PIN".

1. "SUCCESSFUL" will be shown on handset LCD display if

the handset is registered to the base. Cordless handset number will be shown after it returns to idle mode.

2. "FAIL" will be shown on handset LCD display if the cordless handset is failed to registered to the base, register the handset again.

Select Base

This option allows user to select a base.

Remove Handset

This option allows user to remove the registered cordless handset from the base.
